Name Origin: 1825 Gideon Mantell "iguana" "tooth" = odon

Discoverer: Mary Ann Mantell in the 1820's

Type of Dinosaur: Iguanodontid

Age: 128-123 million years ago

Height: 2.75-3 meters hip height (9-9.8 feet)

Length: 10-13 meters (32.8-42.7 feet)


Mass: over 3 tonnes with some estimated to be over 8 tonnes (6,614-17,637 pounds)


Diet: Herbivore
