


Prenoceratops PREN-oh-SER-a-tops

Name Origin: "preno" meaning sloping, referring

to its long, low head shape, and "ceratops"

meaning horn-face

Discoverer: Dorothy and Leo Flammand

Type of Dinosaur: Ceratopsian

Geological Period: Late Cretaceous (Campanian)

Age: ~75 million years ago

Height: ~0.91 meters (~3 feet)

Length: ~1.83 meters (~6 feet)

Mass: ~.07 tonnes (~150 pounds)

Diet: Herbivore


Location: USA: Montana


Fun Facts: Prenoceratops means sloping horn-face, but it doesn't have any horns on its face. Instead, it has a beak at the front of its mouth like a parrot and grinding teeth in the back. It is also in the same family of

dinosaurs as the *Triceratops*.
