Name Origin: “yu” means feathers in Mandarin and “tyrannus” means king or tyrant in Latin

Discoverer: Named in 2012

Type of Dinosaur: Theropod

Geological Period: Early Cretaceous (Aptian)

Age: 125 Million years ago

Height: ~2 meters (~8 feet)

Length: 9 meters (~30 feet)

Mass: 1.36 tonnes (2,998 pounds)

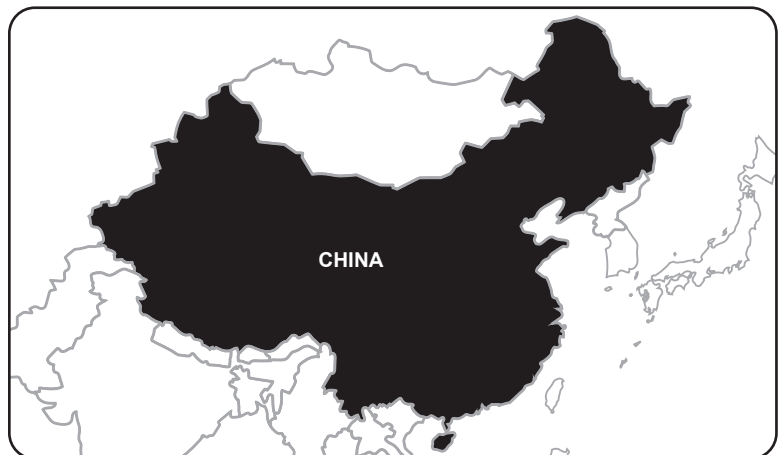
Diet: Carnivore

Fun Facts: The *Yutyrannus* is one of the largest dinosaurs that is known to have been covered in feathers. The feathers of *Yutyrannus* were only 6 or 7 inches long and resembled fluffy ostrich feathers.
